4. Placement test scores (ACT / Accuplacer)





Admission Requirements and Process

 Application / High school or GED/HiSET transcript / Transcripts from all institution's attended / Immunizations / EVEA

Expectations (Minimum GPA of 2.75)

- Any coursework transferred to APSU, regardless of when it was earned, will not be included in the overall GPA calculation.
- If you attended APSU prior to 2015, your previous credits/GPA will count in your overall GPA calculation.
- Your transfer GPA will be used for admission/acceptance to APSU.



Content Specific and Special Education Coursework

 Initial license is Elementary K-5, with an add-on Special Education Interventionist K-8 endorsement.

University Supports

- Candidates will be 'batch' registered by APSU Office of Teacher Education and Partnerships.
- All required textbooks are provided to the student.
- edTPA seminars are provided and are designed to increase the likelihood of passing edTPA.
- Costs of initial assessments are covered. Retakes are the responsibility of the resident.
